

Delineation of scope for the exam in European Law for International Legal Studies

1. Scope

- Core part:
 - Internal market law (fundamental freedoms, non-discrimination, Union citizenship)
 - Competition law (competition law, merger control, state aid law, peripheries, including the respective procedures)
 - Judicial proceedings at the EU courts
- Other:
 - History of European Integration
 - Fundamentals of the EU, its structure and institutions
 - Sources of EU law, legislation and distribution of competences
 - Fundamentals and general principles of EU law, fundamental rights
 - Interaction between Member state law and EU law
 - EU law implementation and enforcement, EU system of legal protection (EU courts and member states courts)
 - Overview economic and monetary policy
 - Overview common commercial policy and external competences
 - Overview area of freedom, security and justice
