

EXAM MODALITIES

Important information on the oral exam MP International Law

Prof Irmgard Marboe

1. Prof Marboe holds oral exams in digital format only in exceptional cases and for important reasons (e.g. hospitalisation), otherwise in person.

3. Please, send deregistration from the exam via e-mail no later than four days before the exam to service.int-law2@univie.ac.at. You will receive a specific time for your exam no later than the day before the exam.
4. Candidates are invited to the exam sessions in blocks of 2 hours at the same time. This serves, among other things, to allow public audience.
5. Each candidate receives three independent questions. The questions are not passed on. The first question is an “easy” question, i.e. it roughly corresponds to the requirements already set in the FÜM I. The second question deals with an important case before international dispute resolution bodies (international courts and arbitral tribunals) or/and with “core issues” of international law. The third question is a specific question in a special area of international law (space law, law of the sea, world trade law, investment law, human rights, environmental law, ...) or arises from a current political issue (to which textbook knowledge must be applied). In accordance with this growing level of specification, the first question is weighted the heaviest and the last the lightest.
6. Please take volume II of the “Österreiches Handbuch des Völkerrechts” (materials) or the “Kodex” with you; its use may be requested during the exam.
7. To verify your identity, please have your student ID card or an official photo ID with a clearly visible current photo ready for the examination.
