Cordula Panosch is a researcher and lecturer at the Department of European, International and Comparative Law at the Faculty of Law of the University of Vienna, where she has been working in the framework of the project “National Point of Contact for Space Law Austria” since 2014. She studied law at the University of Vienna and the Universidad Complutense de Madrid and completed a Bachelor’s degree in communication sciences and anthropology at the Université de Liège. In addition, she obtained a Master’s degree in multilingual communication and international relations at the Université libre de Bruxelles and completed the European Master’s Degree in Human Rights and Democratisation at the European Inter-University Centre for Human Rights and Democratisation in Venice, Italy and the Irish Centre for Human Rights at the National University of Ireland, Galway.

In addition, she undertook a research stay at the Institute of Air and Space Law at the Faculty of Law at McGill University in Montreal, Canada and participated in the Centre for Studies and Research of the Hague Academy of International Law in the Hague, the Netherlands. She has also received specialized training in the areas of EU asylum and immigration law, space law, international election observation and assistance, international civilian peacekeeping and EU development cooperation policy.

Prior to joining the University of Vienna, she worked inter alia at the Austrian Foreign Ministry at the Permanent Mission of Austria to the United Nations in Vienna, the Vienna School of International Studies and the United Nations Office at Vienna. She was also able to gain working experience at the European Parliament, the Foreign Trade Office in Caracas, Venezuela of the Austrian Chamber of Commerce, as well as in international human rights organizations in Europe and Latin America and participated in several election observation missions for the European Union in Latin America and Africa.

She is a member of the International Institute of Space Law (IISL), the European Centre for Space Law (ECSL) and the International Law Association’s (ILA) Committee on Space Law. In addition, she has regularly been a member of the Austrian delegation to the UN Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space and its Subcommittees as well as several Working Groups since 2014. She is also author of several scientific publications on various issues of international law and space law and has received a number of scholarships (inter alia by the University of Vienna, the Austrian Research Council and the International Academy of Astronautics).
